SEARS CRAFTSMAN SCHOLARSHIP – 2002

APPLICATION PROCEDURES

The Sears Craftsman Scholarship is funded to provide an incentive for graduating high school seniors to continue their education at the post secondary level, while acknowledging the academic achievement, citizenship, extracurricular activities, community service, and work experience of each applicant.

The scholarships are fully funded by Sears Craftsman and are administered by Youth & Education Services department of the National Hot Rod Association.

Twenty-one \$1000 scholarships will be granted to three (3) students from each of the seven (7) geographical divisions of the National Hot Rod Association, including all fifty states, Canada, Mexico, and Puerto Rico.

Scholarship applicants must be seniors graduating from a public, private, or parochial school or education center between January 1, 2002 and June 30, 2002. Applicants must be of good character, possess a minimum 2.0 GPA (on a 4.0 scale), show evidence of leadership ability, involvement in extracurricular school and community activities, and planning to attend an accredited (2 yr. - 4 yr.) college, university, or technical/vocational program. Scholarship preference will be given to those applicants planning a career in automotive technology, industrial/technical manufacturing, or marketing.

Applications will be assessed on the applicant's (1) Scholastic record, (2) School activities and community involvement, (3) Personal, handwritten statement (essay), (4) Recommendations, (5) Financial need.

Scholarship application packets must contain the following:

1. Completed application form, including personal statement (essay).
2. Two recommendation forms, one of which must be from a teacher, counselor, or administrator.
3. One official high school transcript indicating **GPA**, and listing all classes and grades through the first semester of your senior year.

It is recommended that all application materials (official application, two recommendation forms, one transcript) be mailed in one packet to the NHRA address listed on the cover letter. (Photocopied application and recommendation forms are acceptable.)

Completed application packets must be postmarked by May 1, 2002.

The 21 scholarship recipients will be notified by June 1, 2002. Due to the number of applications received, notification will be given to the scholarship winners only.

Scholarships are awarded upon verification of student enrollment in an accredited college or trade/vocational school/program. Scholarship funds will be paid to the designated school in the recipient's name. Scholarships must be claimed within one year of the graduation date listed on the scholarship application.

The Sears Craftsman Scholarship is available to any applicant regardless of age, race, creed, color, ethnic origin, or personal belief.

Employees and immediate family members of employees, full or part time, of the National Hot Rod Association, Sears, and Morris International are not eligible for the Sears Craftsman Scholarship.

The application must be completed in full. Incomplete applications will not be considered. Indicate "Not Applicable" (N/A) or "Unavailable" (UN), where appropriate. All application information is for selection purposes only and will be strictly confidential.
